## **Combined Coach Report - Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> August 2018 – Cairngorms & Slochd**

We had a booking total of 32 for this outing. (20 `A` & 12 `B`). After six cancellations, and one extra member turning up on Sunday, we had 27 on the coach (including two guests). The weather was warm with bright conditions, and some cloud as forecast. This persisted all the way from Perth to our walk venues.

We had a toilet stop at Ralia Services as usual, before dropping off the Moderate group at Lynwilg. There was no Less Challenging group, but the Challenging Plus group (7) was dropped off at Glenmore, followed by the Challenging group (11) at the Coire Cas ski centre. The coach then travelled to Slochd, where it was based for the day, to await the Moderate group (9). All groups had bright and dry conditions, with light winds and some cloud, at Munro height.

All groups completed their walks in good time, with the Chall. Plus group reaching the Coire Cas café for refreshments at 15.35, followed by the Chall. group at 16.15. The Moderate group reached Slochd at 15.50 and were taken to Coylumbridge Hilton Hotel for refreshments at the “Woodshed Bar”.

All members enjoyed their walks in the warm, dry weather, and our good monthly turnout continues. We have had a good turnout of guests each month this year, and hopefully this will continue.
